


KPI'S

1. Install solar panels on all Residential Aged Care facilities by the end of 2025.

- 2. Ensure sustainability ratings are recognised in property assets by the end of 2025.
- 3. Conduct a water audit by 30 June 2023 and implement water saving measures across all sites.

- 1. An application has been submitted to the Grid to install Solar panels on Kirami and Meilene aged care sites. ASQ will be going to the market in early 2024 to get the proposal to install solar panels on remaining RACs.
- 2. An internal water audit done by the property team in 2023 showed ASQ has water efficient appliances in place across all commercial sites.
- 3. ASQ has engaged Lucid Consulting to conduct a sustainability rating audit of ASQ's property assets. The key outcome of this work is to determine he most suitable sustainability rating for each property asset within Anglicare Portfolio.






















KPI'S

- 1. Implement an Anglicare waste management policy by 30 June 2023.
- 2. Transition to eco-friendly products for all single use plastic items in the hospitality department by 30 June 2024.
- 3. Implement Menu planning system by the end of FY2025.
- 4. Implement a responsible disposal process for redundant ICT hardware.

- 1. Completed Waste management policy has been implemented.
- 2. QLD government has banned a number of single use plastic products. ASQ still use a number of single use plastic in residential aged care sites. Work is underway to transition to recycled products in hospitality area.
- 3. ICT and Hospitality teams are currently exploring the options for menu planning system.
- 4. Completed redundant ICT equipment gets recycled through G1 asset management
- In 2023 ASQ recycled 5,170 KG of e-waste
- Approx. 600KG of PPE was donated to Griffith university which otherwise would have ended up in landfill
- There was 3% reduction in waste comparing to 2022 (Jan Dec)
- ASQ in partnership with Thread Together diverted 17,500 clothing items from landfill





KPI'S

1. Report on number of hybrid vehicles in fleet every six months. Target to convert 50% cars to hybrid by 30 June 2023.

- 2. Review, update and implement flexible working arrangement policy.
- 3. Number of different models of vehicles piloted.

- 1. Completed As of Dec 2023, 333 out of 650 vehicles are Hybrid. In 2023 Procurement team converted 150 Vehicles from petrol to Hybrid type. This will reduce approx. 94 Tones (6% of total fleet) of CO2 emissions per annum.
- 2. Completed Hybrid and flexible working guidelines were reviewed and updated in October 2023.
- 3. Procurement team are in discussing with Origin energy to start our first Electric Vehicle (EV) trial.
- In 2023 ASQ fleet covered 7,648,527 KMs comparing to 7,327,063 KMs in 2022
- Fuel efficiency increased from 7.04L per 100KM in 2022 to 6.34L per 100KM in 2023

KPI'S

- 1. Number of sourcing initiatives that had sustainability criteria in them each financial year.
- 2. Switch to recycled products for washrooms consumables in residential aged care facilities by 30 June 2024

Status

- 100% of RFPs conducted by the Procurement team included sustainability criteria.
- Having switched RACs
 to Abena incontinence products (made from
 100% renewable energy) in 2023,
 Procurement team are now (2024) working
 with the hospitality team to switch washroom
 products in RACs to recycled options.
