Who are we

The STARH Project is an early intervention service that works alongside families and individuals offering support to stabilise and sustain their housing. STARH is a free, voluntary, safe and confidential service.

The STARH Project provides flexible support through a case management service, tailoring plans to the individual needs of the family or individual.

The STARH Project is committed to empowering clients to take steps towards positive change and achieve success in sustaining safe and stable housing.

Who we support

We support families and individuals living in the Logan Region who have their own tenancy (e.g. private rental, social or community housing) and who are experiencing difficulties sustaining their tenancy, or who are at risk of homelessness.



Clients at risk of losing their housing could be experiencing one or more of the following:

- tenancy issues
- financial stress, debt and unforeseen financial hardship
- physical and/or emotional health concerns
- loss or reduction in employment
- relationship or family breakdown
- social isolation
- unsafe or unstable housing.

STARH staff work with people to:

- stabilise and sustain housing
- link to services and support within the community
- support the development of life skills and household management skills
- strengthen connections with family and community
- provide information, advice, planning and support.

The STARH Project works in collaboration with other services to increase support to families and individuals through links to:

- health and legal services
- employment and training
- family services
- specialist services
- other organisations.

STARH Intake will assess eligibility for the program and provide information, advice and referral as required. If the STARH Project is unable to assist you or you require a different service, support will be provided to link you to an appropriate service.
