Thread Together Queensland has had a long association with the Micah Common Ground project, helping to support their clients who have been at risk of homelessness. This month, that association was extended to the Micah Street to Home program, a dedicated assertive outreach program devoted to supporting people currently sleeping rough. The Street to Home team attended the Thread Together Clothing Hub and gathered clothing to support 50 people (families and individuals) who are linked in with their service.
